House of Clement

Warm wood tones, soothing neutrals and crisp blues prevail in these bright and cheery rooms, artfully transformed by gifted interior designer, Gilles Clement of Westport based, House of Clement. Mr. Clement stated that, "it was a rare treat to work with clients who had such an eye for design and were able to communicate their needs and appreciate the direction in which the project went." He added that, "his inspiration for the project was to succeed in the challenge of marrying his clients' love for sophisticated, traditional style with timeless, cosmopolitan design".

Located in North Stamford near the Greenwich border, the home was con-

structed in 2007 but didn't find its way into the current homeowners' hearts until 2010 when they were relocating from Scottsdale, Arizona. With children out and off to college the couple sought to downsize. The house had good bones but many rooms were still "blank canvases" waiting to be finished when they met Mr. Clement and asked him to undertake the design of the living room and breakfast nook.

While the beautifully carved stone mantel in the living room existed when he began, he opted to replace the smaller windows flanking it with two that were larger in scale. This allowed more natural light to fill the space and opened up the wall to

views of the surrounding property. A set of three double height windows lift the eye up keeping the space light and airy. The custom designed Asian inspired contemporary console table adds a bit of "drama" to the room and provides an elegant stage for the reproduction Chinese export vase it supports.

A textured wool area rug designed by Mr. Clement grounds the well balanced seating arrangement centered in the room. Opposing sofas upholstered in a navy and ivory woven by Kravet boast nail heads with blue tape trimming their skirts. Navy decorative pillows accent the sofas reflecting light off of the Swarvoski crystals used to form the geometric patterns in their design. Reproduction French bergere chairs wear a much more con-



temporary, geometric print that's been outlined with blue linen. Full length drapery panels dress the windows and have been designed using a deep blue and white floral by Beacon Hill finished with whimsical wood trim by Kravet. Floor lamps in an antique silver glaze are outfitted with Chinese silk shades topped with Lucite finials. Antique sconces from the owners' private collection flank artwork by Clement-Kamena above the mantel. French oak floors in both the living room and entry hall were lightened and in the case of the entry hall's, redesigned with a parquet pattern.

Infused with morning light, the breakfast nook makes a bold statement with walls covered in a large scale Chinoiserie paper by Lee Jofa, crisp white lacquered furnishings and dramatic views of the surrounding property. Taking great care not to obstruct the views, Mr. Clement designed the full-length drapery panels to hang above the transoms and stacked them outside the windows. The deep orange field color in the fabric sets off its blue pattern and introduces a warm tone into the predominately blue and white scheme. Above the table, Mr. Clement had an existing chandelier refinished using blue, orange and white to unify his color choices. Wall sconces were treated in a similar fashion. A casual blue and white check was covers the chair cushions and plays off the blue and white wall covering nicely. He now describes this once unfinished space as, "happy and trivial, yet warm and welcoming."

With his thoughtful mix of texture and finishes, Mr. Clement has transformed these once "blank canvas" into the beautiful rooms you see before you. He calls it, "cosmo-chic meets country- trivial" but his clients now call it home.
